Rebate Changes? Yes, you heard that right!

As part of our commitment to our members, Big Horn REA along with our power supplier Tri-State Generation & Transmission, is proud to offer rebates! There will be a few changes when it comes to the rebates.

The timeframe will remain the same, you must submit your itemized receipt that clearly shows detailed product make & model information, associated labor costs, consumer name, date and verification of purchase/ payment unless otherwise noted within 90 days of purchase.

Big-Horn REA as well as Tri-State reserves the right to modify and/or stop this program at any time.

Starting January 1st, 2023, Big Horn REA will match 50% of the Tri-State rebate.

After submitting the rebate, there is a preliminary incentive that is calculated when the application form is complete. Please note that this amount is only an estimate and may vary from the actual rebate payment based on application review and calendar year. The actual rebate amount will reflect the value for the calendar year in which it is submitted. Rebate calculations will not be modified to reflect prior year incentives.

Tri-State will send a single rebate payment to Big Horn for all approved Electrify and Save incentive applications during a specific period.

 All air-source heat pump incentives are based on the total "size" of the heat pump system's outdoor unit or (in some cases) units, specifically the outdoor unit coil capacity in tons; while the indoor unit(s) impact the system efficiency ratings,

indoor exchange unit capacities are not to be included in the total system size on the rebate application.

• The bills on all monthly electric accounts will be computed and mailed to the address furnished by the member generally no later than the 9th day of the month. All bills are due and payable by the due date shown on the bill and are delinguent the following day.

• A charge of 1.5% per month will be added to any outstanding balance remaining as of the day after the due date. Notice of this charge will be printed on each statement

• Delinguent notices will be mailed the day after the due date that is on your bill on **ALL** delinquent accounts, giving notice that if payment is not received or arrangements for payments are not made, service may be discontinued.
