

>>> ENERGY EFFICIENCY: TIP OF THE MONTH

A well-designed landscape can add beauty to your home and reduce home heating and cooling costs. Plant deciduous trees with high, spreading crowns to the south of your home to block sunlight in the summer and reduce the need for air conditioning. Deciduous trees lose their leaves in the winter, allowing sunlight to warm your home.

Plant evergreen trees and shrubs with low crowns to block winter winds. Dense evergreen trees and shrubs planted to the north and northwest are the most common type of windbreak and can help lower energy used for home heating.

TRI-STATE VISIT

Big Horn's power supplier Tri-State G&T CEO Duane Highley and associates Reg Rudolph and Becky Condie attended February's board meeting. Rudolph presented information on the potential Bring Your Own Resource (BYOR) program that is pending Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) approval. This program allows members such as Big Horn to build a renewable resource that is owned by and serving load of Big Horn's but incorporated into the Tri-State system. Highley touched on the rate increase, the potential federal funding projects, member power contract terms and the potential exit of La Plata Electric Association (LPEA). Condie is the new Member Relations representative for the Wyoming members. She is based out of Wheatland.

ATTENTION IRRIGATORS

You will see your annual Horsepower Charge on the bill you receive the first part of May.

The minimum annual charge under the irrigation rate will be the highest of the following:

The horsepower multiplied by \$30.

For example - a service with a 25 HP motor would be billed 25 x \$30 = \$750.00

A charge of \$200.00.

Big Horn REA's Operation RoundUp Foundation Board is turning 25 years old this year. Operation RoundUp has made several impacts in our communities over the years. Donated funds have been utilized for building improvements to Senior Centers, community halls, CPR mannequins, playground equipment, sports equipment, and other items. Funds have also been for member medical issues and fire loss. There is not a community in our service territory that hasn't benefited from this generous member-funded organization.

If you aren't already participating in Operation RoundUp, contact our office and get set up. Your electric bill will round up to the next highest dollar every month, and the additional cents will then go to the Operation RoundUp fund.

The RoundUp Foundation Board evaluates all applications submitted and determines who will receive the funding and how much will be donated to applicants. This board is separate from the Big Horn REA Board.

This small change, together with other members, will make a big difference in our communities.
