In total for all the meetings there were over 300 members that attended our district meetings. Several topics were discussed with members in attendance at district meetings. One of the items that was emphasized was the Ten Sleep Canyon underground project. Big Horn has been working hard on securing grant funding and coordinating with Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) as well as the Forest Service on this undertaking. Approximately 22 miles of overhead powerline will be converted to underground serving cabin owners, a ski lodge and emergency services.


Our power poles have just one purpose.. to support the power lines and equipment needed to deliver electricity to our members. Please do not use our poles are bulletin boards!

Did you know ceiling fans can help you save energy? Ceiling fans create a windmill effect on your skin to make you feel a few degrees cooler. Raise the thermostat a few degrees and turn on fans to reduce air conditioning costs.

Set fan blades to rotate counterclockwise during summer months and clockwise during winter months. Remember, ceiling fans cool people but don't actually lower the indoor temperature. Turn them off when you leave the room.

LOW-COST TIPS


Plant trees and shrubs to shade the exterior of your home.
